## Initial Improv and Set-Up

### Ingredients:

1 young actress-confused (Karla)

1 piano player-pseudo brother (Andrew)

1 actor male 1 stage manager male 1 make-up artist female 1 technical director male 1 director male 1 wardrobe mistress female 1 bass player optional 1 drummer optional

Start off with 1 empty stage and house lighting. Let stand about 2 minutes. Slowly blend in musicians (including PIANO PLAYER) and all technical set up. After letting simmer about 3 minutes, combine in all prop and set requirements, mixed with all remaining personnel. Stir gently, making sure all ingredients mix thoroughly. Carefully separate KARLA from

the rest of the mixture, allowing her to stand near center- satge. Staring off into the audience, KARLA does a contin- uous vocal warm-up. lowly bring the rest of the concoction to a boil; making sure to mix the whole time. KARLA takes the mike from the frozen DIRECTOR and then, strictly through eye-contact, tells all other characters to leave the stage. (This does not include the musicians. They're union; so they can stay.) Once all required characters are off the stage, KARLA resumes her original vocal warm-up stance. She has been singing this whole time. (She's very talented.)
